WHAT IS GIVSKUD ZOO?

Givskud Zoo was founded as a lion park in 1969, but today it is home to many other animals as well. Officially recognized by the Danish State in 1989, it is now a modern zoo with all the duties and obligations that follow. The park's main objectives are education, the conservation of endangered species, and research – all in a recreational environment that allows visitors to experience the animals in their natural surroundings.

Apart from the zoo, Givskud Zoo also has a nature foundation. The purpose of the foundation is to support nature conservation projects around the world. One of the projects they support is the Limbe Wildlife Centre in Cameroon.





ASSIGNMENT 1: SAVING THE PARROTS

One of the main purposes of Givskud Zoo is to educate their visitors, not only about the animals in the zoo, but also about nature conservation and the zoo's contribution to other wildlife preservation centres. Givskud Zoo would like you to make a short video presentation that sums up the general purpose of Limbe Wildlife Centre and the centre's work with the protection and rehabilitation of the African grey parrot. Your presentation should have a maximum length of 5 minutes (300 seconds). Your video must be handed in when we meet in Aarhus.

How you make your video presentation is up to you. It can be just you speaking, but you may also include pictures or props.

YOUR VIDEO PRESENTATION SHOULD INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING:

- A presentation of Limbe Wildlife Centre
- A description of the centre's work with the protection and rehabilitation of the African grey parrot
- A description of how Givskud Zoo Naturfond actively supports Limbe Wildlife Centre
- An ending where you encourage the viewers to donate to the foundation
