SAN FRANCISCO (CALIFORNIA)

San Francisco, also known as City of the Bay, is the fourth largest city in the state of California with its approximately 800,000 inhabitants.

San Francisco is known for its cultural diversity, LGBT+ rights movement, environmental activism and has an image in pop culture of being one of the most left-wing big cities in America. San Francisco has one of the oldest and best-known Chinatowns in America.

The city is a major tourist destination in the USA. There are many museums, sport events, modern art events, and unique annual events like their big Pride Parade and a grand celebration of the Chinese Lunar New Year.

San Francisco is also known for its many landmarks, like the Golden Gate Bridge and the infamous prison island of Alcatraz.

There are many national park sites close to San Francisco. The most well-known is "The Golden Gate National Recreation Area", which is basically in the city.

NASHVILLE (TENNESSEE)

Nashville, also known as Music City, is the state capital of Tennessee and with its approximately 680,000 inhabitants it is also the largest city in the state.

Nashville is most known for its large music scene, especially for country music. There are plenty of music festivals throughout the year and many large concerts and smaller live performances for many genres of music. It even has a big modern museum dedicated to country music "The Country Music Hall of Fame and Museum", located in downtown Nashville.

The city offers many other musical themed museums for various artists and genres. Nashville was an important location during the American civil war (1861-1865) and tourists can visit historical landmarks and battlefields near the city.

Nashville is also the home of the two sports teams; The Tennessee Titans playing the NFL (National Football League), and The Nashville Predators who play in the NHL (National Hockey League).

FAIRBANKS (ALASKA)

Fairbanks is the second-largest city in Alaska, with a population of approximately 32,000 people living in the city itself. The city is located inland along the Chena River.

Fairbanks and its surrounding area are known for its great view of the northern light, making it one of the best places in the world to experience it. There are many tours that take tourists outside of Fairbanks to watch the northern lights.

Two noteworthy museums in Fairbanks are “University of Alaska Museum of the North”, which focuses on the native people of Alaska (Inuits) and the environment of Alaska. The other is “Pioneer Park”, a historical theme park with a focus on the gold rush in Alaska’s early history.

Fairbanks offers many festivals like the “Midnight Sun Festival” celebrating the 24-hour daylight, and The World Ice Art Championships, where artists carve their ice sculptures.

Outside of the city is the “Chena Hot Springs Resort”, where visitors can soak in the soothing hot springs pools.

All year round the area around Fairbanks offers many different activities in the wild Alaskan countryside. There are many tours for tourists to join: Skiing, canoeing, hiking, ice skating, snowshoeing, ice fishing and dog sledding.

There are many guided nature tours, like trips into the “Denali National Park and Preserve” to experience the wild arctic nature.

CHICAGO (ILLINOIS)

Chicago is the third largest city in the US and is known as “the Windy City”. The city of Chicago has a population of approximately 2,750,000 and is located on the shores of Lake Michigan. There are almost too many points of interest in a metropole like Chicago. There are many museums, music festivals and parades, like the “Bud Billiken parade”, the country’s largest African American parade.

Chicago is home to the famous basketball team Chicago Bulls and the likewise famous baseball team Chicago White Sox.

On the food scene, Chicago is known for its “Chicago style deep dish pizza” and Chicago style hot dogs.

There are many attractions and landmarks in the city. The Skydeck at Willis Tower gives an observation view of the city from its glass box.

At the Adler Planetarium you can discover the galaxy in their high-tech theater, and in the museum exhibits, learn more about how diverse space and planets are.

There are many parks in Chicago. To name a few, there is the “Garfield Park”, mostly known for its huge indoor fields called the “Garfield Park Conservatory”. Another famous park is the “Millennium Park”, home to the iconic Cloud Gate statue (aka “The Bean”), interactive activities, and plenty of green space.

Along the shore of Michigan lake is the “The Navy Pier”. The Navy Pier is a huge area with gardens, attractions, shops, restaurants and concert venues. One of the iconic attractions is the 150-foot Ferris wheel.
